## Important information about the coronavirus.

I'm sure that you will have heard on the news about the coronavirus. All schools are receiving regular updates from the government about this virus, and currently the risk of catching the virus in the UK remains **very low**. However, if you took your child abroad during the holiday to Italy or one of the other affected areas and he/she develops typical coronavirus symptoms which can include: fever, cough/ cold like symptoms, shortness of breath within 14 days of their return. You should **IMMEDIATELY**:

- Keep them indoors and avoid contact with other people.
- Call NHS 111 to inform them that your child has recently travelled to an affected area and follow their guidance.

**There is no action to be taken if your child is not displaying any symptoms.**

In order to contain the spread of any virus, normal hygiene rules apply, including ensuring your child is encouraged to cover their nose and mouth with a disposable tissue when sneezing, coughing, wiping and blowing the nose, disposing of used tissues immediately in a bin, and washing hands regularly.
