Share a story together, perhaps a story from another culture? Ask your child to identify any countries, cultures or food that are referenced in the story. THEN... Can your child design a book cover? Or can they write an alternative ending instead?	Let your child choose a story from around the world to listen to. Can they summarise the main events by drawing a comic strip or writing them down? https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/class-clips-video/english-ks1-tales-from-around-the-world/zmybnrd	Look at the flags from around the world. How many flags does your child recognise? Ask your child to choose one of the countries and read online about their culture, cuisine, popular sport and significant/famous people from this country. https://flagpedia.net/index	Discuss a holiday that your child has been on or a place they've visited. Get them to design a postcard and write about what they did there.	After the reading task, your child can create an information report on their chosen country and organise their paragraphs using these headings: culture, cuisine, popular sport and significant/famous people	Ask your child to list adjectives and places names that begin with the same letter. e.g. fascinating France, sweltering Sri Lanka, exquisite England. Can they put these into a list poem and perform it?

Print or look at a map of the world. There are so many countries. Pick 5 countries and measure the distance (using cm or mm) on the map to see which countries are closest and furthest from we live. How many cm is it to Africa? How many to Japan? https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/z4nsgk7	Your child can find real life arrays – this could be eggs in a tray or candles in a row, etc. Once found, get your child to write the calculation for that array. Can they find the fact family? (E.g. $3 \times 4 = 12$, $4 \times 3 = 12$, $12 \div 3 = 4$ & $12 \div 4 = 3$). https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zrf8jhw	Choosing a times table of their choice can your child create a rap song/poem/poster to help them remember the multiplication facts linked to this times table. Can they include the corresponding division facts in their rap/poem/poster too?	Lets Create- Create a piece of art to show the planet earth. This could be a painting/ a model or a drawing! Can you show the different countries/continents?	Get active- Take a day to go out and spend time in a new place with the family. Explore the world around you and compare it to some of the places you have learnt about. Think about the weather/ buildings/ people/ nature. Explore and see what you can notice!	Around the world- The world is a big place and everywhere is so different. Take some time to look at different countries. What do you like about them? What do you dislike? Share your thoughts with someone in your house.
