Note down your score in your reading diary.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Read a new book about animals, or research on the internet about an animal and create a fact file of all the things you learnt.</p>	<p>Write a set of instructions for how to look after a pet. Remember to include what you need and what you do. What times would you need to do these things for and how long?</p>	<p>Design an information leaflet about an animal of their choice. Remember to use headings and subheadings.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Write a description of a fictional animal that has just been discovered. Think about what it looks like, where it lives and what it eats. Draw a picture to show what this new creature is like.</p>	<p>Play guess the animal. Pick an animal <i>and give family member's clues to see if they can figure out what animal you are thinking of. Make sure you don't give easy clues!</i> Use good descriptive language.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Describe an imaginary trip to the zoo to a family member. Describe your thoughts and feelings about each animal you saw.</p>
