Draw a scene you can imagine from one of the books you have read. Ask the people in your household to share their viewpoint about what they think is taking place in the image.	Re-write a chapter/section of your book from <i>another character's</i> viewpoint. Will the same events occur? Will the character share the same emotions and thoughts?	Go to 'Love Reading UK'. Explore the Book of the Month and previous books of the month. How many have you read?	Mrs Gillam says: 'We have missed out on a lot of learning, when all children return to school, they should not have any breaks to catch up.' Write a letter to Mrs Gillam sharing your viewpoint about this statement.	Write a poem about our school, your friend or a teacher. Make sure your viewpoint <i>about the 'thing' or 'person' you choose to write about</i> is clear in your poem.	Debate- Is good more powerful than evil? Is it worse to fail at something or never attempt it in the first place? Is it more important to be liked or respected? Choose a question to answer. Write a speech and use real -life examples to justify your opinion.

Create and do a daily mile/laps in your back garden or local park with your family. Can you do 100 laps in a week?	Leave a positive and kind message in your window for people who walk past. What do you want them to see from their viewpoint?	Research famous viewpoints from around the world (e.g. The Eiffel Tower). Draw what you think you would see from this viewpoint. After this, you can design and create a miniature scale of the landmarks that give these viewpoints. Ask different people in your household to give their viewpoint about your creation.
