

Remember to look for special friends and Fred talk.</p>	<p>- Make a list of ten different sports and put them in alphabetical order.</p> <p>- Think of questions you love to ask their favourite athlete. They could write a list of questions using a range of question words such as 'when', 'why', 'who', 'what', 'where' and 'how'</p>	<p>Ask your child to add the 'ing' suffix to these verbs: jump, skip, hike, throw, catch, kick, smile, run & shout e.g. jump + ing = jumping. Which root words need the 'e' removing first?</p> <p>-Ask your child to design a gold medal and present it to somebody deserving within the household. Why have they chosen this person? Ask them to write a few sentences and include the word 'and', 'because' and 'if'.</p>	<p>Play what Sport am I? Describe/Mime a sport. E.g. there is a ball and a wooden bat. There are players standing around ready to catch.-Cricket!! Talk about the favourite sports you like play and watch.</p>

<p>Number Count in 10s up to 100. Can you count backwards in 10s from 100.</p> <p>Write the numerals for the following numbers:</p> <p>Ninety three Sixty four Eighty nine One hundred Seventy eight.</p> <p>Ask your child to write numbers you say to them.</p>	<p>Play 'Catch' with your child using a ball or anything else that can be thrown safely. Instead of counting in 1s each time the ball is caught, ask your child to only count every second, fifth or tenth catch.</p> <p>Use Mathletics to access place value up to 100 and time this week.</p>	<p>Place an object on the ground and use positional language such as forward, backwards, up, down, left and right to direct them to the object. You could switch roles and get your child to give the directions. If you wanted to make it harder, you could use a blindfold but be extra careful!</p>	<p>Try some yoga poses for this week.</p> 	<p>Design your own sports team kit. Include a team name, colour scheme and what sport you team will play.</p> <p>Include: T-shirt, shorts, socks.</p> <p>Be creative with patterns and different colours.</p> <p>Further activity: Design your team's stadium.</p> <p>Design a team logo.</p>	<p>Challenge your child to invent their very own game for the 2021 Olympics. Look at a list of all of the sports that already compete in the summer Olympics. Can they write a set of instructions for the new game or draw illustrations. Why not test the game out as a family?</p> <p>Task your child with designing and making their very own obstacle course in the garden. Ask them to draw and label their design first and include all of the equipment they need. They can then use their design to create their obstacle course. Ask the family to complete the obstacle course whilst your child times them. Your child could even make medals from tin-foil or any other suitable material and present them to the winner during a winner's ceremony.</p>
