Write down any words you are unsure of the meaning. If you have a dictionary look up the meaning of these words or use a computer to look them up. Can you try to use these words this week?</p>	<p>Share stories with your family. Do you have a brother or sister you could read to?</p>	<p>During celebrations people often play games. Write a <i>set of instructions</i> for 'How to play'. Remember to include a list of things you will need. Also do not forget to include headings and subheadings.</p>	<p>Write a postcard to a family member recounting a celebration that has just taken place.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Write a non-chronological report about a particular religious festival you have found out about.</p>	<p>Look through photographs of celebrations <i>you've had as a family</i>. What are your family traditions? What is the next celebration in your family or have you had a celebration recently? How will you/how did you celebrate?</p>

Maybe you could do some of the following.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Make the beds in the morning. 2) Hang out the washing. 3) Put your clean washing away. 4) Sweep/vacuum. 5) Wash up/dry up. 	<p>Why not build a den at home or in the garden. Ask a grown up to help with chairs/tables/sheets/blankets etc. Perhaps you could make your own celebration party with snacks for you and your siblings/toys.</p>	<p>How do people celebrate in other cultures? Can you research a country and how they celebrate? E.g. how do the Chinese celebrate new year. How do the Spanish celebrate Christmas? Perhaps you could create a fact file.</p>
