



Literacy

In Literacy we will be studying the book 'Goodnight Mr Tom'. Children will read this book to create both fictional and non-fictional pieces of writing relating to World War II. In addition children will also study film narrative and recounts. Children will develop speaking and listening skills and use these skills to create end pieces of writing. We will use 'Talk for writing' again to support our writing process.

Numeracy

Every term in numeracy we work on number skills, written and mental calculation methods and skills, fractions and decimals, statistics, measures and data handling.

We are still working on our arithmetic skills every day to improve our counting, number facts and calculation skills.

Science: We will be studying materials in Science this term.
